

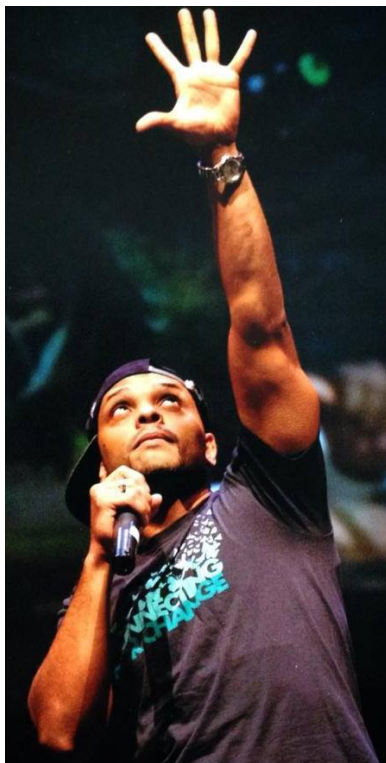


An Art With A History featuring Tem Blessed
